Exalted Ruler Message — Lee Klein

It's hard to believe that the fall season is upon us! At the Elks, that means all the old events are back and some new will be happening.

Before we get to the September calendar, I need to follow-up as I had previously mentioned I would discuss the "State of the Elks".

1) Approximately five days after I was asked and accepted the "Interim" ER position, the Bismarck-Mandan Elks Lodge was served an Executive Order No. 18-031 which basically mandated that an independent, comprehensive audit be made and also placed the Lodge under control of the Grand Lodge until the audit was completed and the findings presented. In essence, management at the Lodge was put in a "lame duck" position until completion of the audit. The Grand Lodge assigned two representatives who knew the importance of allowing the day-to-day operations and the Board of Manager to conduct business as usual under the umbrella conditions of the Executive Order. The audit began in April and the final exit interview was held in late July.

2) The audit was presented to the Grand Lodge for review and on August 7, 2018, Roger True, PGER and North Dakota State Sponsor, along with Michael T. Luhr, GER, rescinded the Executive Order. In Mr. True's letter, he indicated the following: "Although

this audit identified several items of concern, it did not identify any major financial misconduct. This audit should satisfy the questions and rumors that have surrounded the Lodge. Once all the corrective actions are completed and adhered to, the Lodge will have the opportunity to start making a profit." I point out this section of Mr. True's letter as the rumors circulating in the Lodge membership and eventually into the community had shed a negative public image. Those rumors have had an impact on the Lodge including finances, morale, and a degrading effect on both the employees and management of the Club even to the point of personally identifying employees by name. The people that fabricated these vicious rumors, in my opinion, need to apologize to the Lodge membership as well as to the employees that were targeted. Will this happen? Probably not. I felt it is important to bring this to the forefront. Any further attempts to spread these false rumors will be dealt with within the Grand Lodge Statutes regarding such behavior!!

3) The audit did identify areas of concern and made recommendations for each. I am glad to report that all but one of these concerns have been addressed and implemented. Our accounting department and management are seeing some results in the daily operations of the Lodge by becoming more efficient and cost effective.

4) Another item of the Grand Lodge mandate addressed their concern of the "conduct and in fighting" of the Officers and elected Trustees of the Lodge which tended to bring the Lodge into disrespect. It has been my number one objective to resolve this on-going conflict and I'm happy to say that the new Officers and the Board of Managers have all agreed to be on the "same page". Again my objective is to ensure this continued unity and never revert back to the conflicting behavior of the past!!

5) We are taking the positive results of this audit to review the way we do day-to-day business operations. The Lodge needs to review all operations and make positive governance changes to enhance our bottom line by being able to deliver our products and services more cost effectively. The Board and I are looking at and discussing the need to establish specific areas and assign Board members with expertise to each so that needs and recommendations can be discussed that they feel are warranted. These areas will cover the operations from building and grounds to financial, human resources, IT, accounting, marketing, membership and a Grand Lodge liaison. Upon completion of these assignments, I will post the Chairs for the membership's information.

It is also our intention to set up a Membership Advisory Board. The purpose is to have five members at-large meet to discuss the Lodge activities and make suggestions or recommendations to enhance our member's experiences at the Lodge. If interested, please contact the front office. I only have one condition - two of the five members must be women. Our good lady Elks needs a voice in our Club also.

I know many of you are reading this newsletter and are going WOW! That is exactly what I said after I accepted this Interim ER position and began my due diligence of the current and past events. The Board and I have committed to a very large and aggressive agenda. Is it going to happen overnight? No. Positive changes have already been implemented and as previously mentioned; the political climate has stabilized and will be going forward.

Now I need to reach out to you the





Elks National Foundation Supports College Scholarships

The Elks National Foundation is rated only next to the Federal Government in providing scholarships for college education in the United States.

In North Dakota it provides, at a minimum, five four-year scholarships of \$4,000 each on the national level. Two are based on the "Most Valuable Student Competition" which senior students apply for through our local Lodge competition. Three are "Legacy Scholarships" and applied for directly to the Elks National Foundation. The students applying for these scholarships must be the child of a parent or grandparent of a current member of the Elks. These are also four-year scholarships of \$4,000 each. This totals \$20,000 in scholarships each year. #7424

A portion of the Elks National Foundation grant to the North Dakota Elks Association also supports four one-year "Most Valuable Student Scholarships" of \$1,500 each. These are selected from the students advancing from the local Lodge competitions.

This is only a portion of the benefits the National Foundation provides in North Dakota.

Donations to the Elks National Foundation in any amount help not only North Dakota but all of the states in their charitable work by the grants to the states.




