will share more details as they develop.


This is why membership and active participation in the club are so important. Your involvement helps ensure we can provide a strong lodge home for both our members and guests while we plan for the future.

TRUSTEES REPORT

Procedure for Proposal to Sell the Elks Building

The Board of Trustees and the Board of Managers of the Bismarck-Mandan Elks Lodge 1199 have come to the difficult decision that we will have to relocate our Elks lodge and club from its current building. The building is getting old and the costs of maintaining this building with a diminishing and aging membership is no longer financially feasible. The procedure for selling our lodge building set out by the Grand Lodge Statutes is as follows:

A written proposal for the sale must be read on the Lodge floor at least two but not more than 8 weeks prior to the scheduled date for a vote. The proposal must set forth the proposed sale of the property, the persons authorized to act for the Lodge and the amount to be received by the Lodge. A Notice of the date, time and location of the regular or special meeting at which the proposal is to be voted is to be provided to each Member of the Lodge at least 10 Days before the scheduled meeting. At the meeting the proposal to sell the property must be approved by at least 2/3 of the Members present. Once the proposal to sell has been approved by 2/3 of the Members, the Proposal must be submitted to the Grand Lodge for its approval and determination that the Proposal is financially sound and in the best interests of the Lodge and the Order.
